Interaction between ADAP and DC Health Link plans

From the DC Health website:

- “The **DC Health Pharmacy Benefits Program** provides HIV-related prescription drugs to under-insured and uninsured individuals living with HIV/AIDS in DC.”
 - This Program includes the DC AIDS Drug Assistance Program (DC ADAP).
 - DC ADAP is one of several methods by which DC provides vital HIV/AIDS medications for some of its most vulnerable populations.

- “Just because you have health insurance does not mean you are not eligible for the **DC AIDS Drug Assistance Program (DC ADAP)**.”
 - If you meet the eligibility criteria and are enrolled in a health insurance plan on your own or as part of a group (e.g., you have insurance through your job), DC ADAP can help by paying your monthly premiums and/or deductibles and co-pays for medications on the DC ADAP drug formulary.
- HBX staff is following up to learn more details about DC Health-ADAP.
- Can carriers share insights?
 - How many DC Health Link enrollees have ADAP?
 - Do carriers outreach on ADAP to enrollees with HIV?
 - Pharmacy operations: are carriers aware of when secondary coverage is applied to a copay for people enrolled in ADAP?
- All – Any thoughts interactions between DC-ADAP and the clinical scenario for zero cost sharing?
